

Park Commission Meeting Minutes

Tuesday, Sept 4, 2018 (normal August meeting)

Community Park

7:00 P.M.

ATTENDANCE: Greg Roblee, Barb Schroeder, Ryan Paschke, Tim James, Lou Judge, and Jim Beard; Excused: John Conrad. Also present: Tony Nowak (Town Parks & Forestry), and Jack Anderson (Town Chairman).

Call to Order: at 7:00 pm by Greg Roblee.

Minutes: Approved by Ryan and Greg.

Treasure Report: Park Fees for Land Account – \$16,066.00 as of August 20, 2018.

Old Business

Archery Range Agreement update: Slowly making progress. Tony is getting an updated bid from ProBuild. Build date is to be determined (the planned date was open day of bow hunting –whops). Tony reported that most of the base concrete pads have been poured. The rest of the pads will be poured when the bleacher pads are poured.

Bleachers: Tony reported that this is still on the To Do list. The marking company is way behind in being available to mark lines.

Greenville Stars Baseball Tournament: An email was received after the tournament saying Thank You and that all went well.

Light poles at sledding hill: Approval was given by the Town Board. Buss Electric will get the project added to their schedule with installation occurring toward the end of October. It will be ready for the winter sledding season.

Bean Bag Tournament special event: Because the Park Board was not meeting till September 4th this request was reviewed via email so that it could be submitted for approval at the August 27th Town Board meeting. Approval was given as long as it was ok with the Civic Club regarding the start of their Fright Night project. This request was approved via email by a vote of Yes – 6, No – 0, Passed.

New Business

Sports Complex –Tony reported that the kick-off with **Rettler Corporation** (John) was held August 28th. First meeting was with Town Staff looking at the big picture of road assess, water/sewer available, etc. Second was with area groups/organizations. Tony reported that a lot of good info was gathered.

Rettler will now submit 3 concept drawings by the end of September/beginning of October these will be reviewed by the Park Board and the Sports Complex Committee. There will then be a Public input session. Information gathered at those sessions will then be used by Rettler to develop a blended plan by November/December. The hope is to have the plan presented to the Town Board by December.

Lions Park: No projects being planned at this time. Plan is to leave the ground settle and then install curbing in the spring. Projects in the quadrant will be money drive – as the funds are available the projects will be done.

Budget: Capital Budget was submitted by Tony.

Comprehensive Plan

Sports Complex – start funding for roads in this park

Community Park drainage – with planning for the bleacher pads it was noted that drainage issues continue to be a problem at this park. Tony would like Cedar Corp (our hired Engineers) to do a study of the infrastructure we would need to correct the present issues.

Tennis courts at Community Park – This court is going to need replacement. Future planning would be to look at a new/larger area and repurpose this court (possible a Pickle ball court) and still maintain the basketball usage.

Lions Park – Street Lighting: Replace the older green fiberglass lights that the lens keep falling off. They would be replaced with black metal type that are also in the park.

Lions Park – parking lot: Looking at parking by the small barn pavilion.

Lions Park – Repaving the road down to the big barn as well as the area around the barn.

Lions Park – install a dumpster enclosure by the present storage area

Other Business:

Hoffman Property: Tony has not talked to Joel about this property regarding the lot lines.

Jack's Town Informational: (preview of information that will be in the Fall Town Newsletter.)

Town Vision and Mission: Jack gave information regarding the Town's new Vision and Mission. The statement will be based on using strategy to meet Town goals. Ideas mentioned were that Recreation Trails be connected. These will be looked at as roads are updated/added. Priority of Town equipment and money will go to priority projects.

Greenville Roads and speed limits: Jack and Joel have been meeting and letter writing to get support for several needed road/intersection issues. Push to get 76 rebuilt not just resurfaced, get support to get Hyw 15 built, intersection improvement at 76 and School Road (possibly look at grant money for lights or round about), speed limit reduced to 45 mph from Hyw 15 to Hyw 96, crosswalk lights at Parkview & 76 as well as at Hibiscus and 15.

Fire Station: Formal design done by mid-January with hope for bids being in February. The station would be ready by Fall/Winter 2020. Then the retrofitting of the prior station would start.
