b. Greenville Women's Club Award recognizing an Outstanding Greenville Citizen.

Andy Peters was awarded the Greenville Women's Club Award for his years of service to a variety of organizations including the Lions Club. The AMVets Post 30 presented Andy with an American Flag.

The First Responders and Fire Department each received \$1,000 in appreciation for all that they do for the community.

6. TOWN CHAIRMAN

a. Year in review and a look to the future.

Town Chairman Jack Anderson provided a review of 2015: The mill rate remains one of the lowest in the area, 86 new construction building permits with a large number of other permits issued, Town Constable Vicki Prey received almost 900 calls in 2015, the Emergency Management Plan was updated by Chris Schlechta to put us in line with County, State and Federal Government, call volume continues to trend upward for fire and EMS; in 2015 there were 208 fire and 297 first responder calls for service, as well as spending a countless number of hours on training and public education, Parks and Recreation worked on a new Comprehensive Outdoor Plan for 2015-2019 and on the CB trail, Public Works was recognized for their work keeping the roads plowed and safe, the water department was able to include the Crestview subdivision to the Sanitary District and have found a number of ways to save the Town money, Administration is looking at adding a polling location, continued work on dredging on Everglade and adding bike paths along with a number of other projects.

b. Brief review of annual report.

Town Administrator Dave Tebo provided a review of the annual financial report.

RE: Wetland & Navigable Stream Violations by Town Officials

Dear Chairman Anderson,

As a representative of the group of Greenville residents and property owners known as *Ethics First! Greenville*, I offer the following thoughts regarding the recent revelations surrounding illegal excavation projects in the area South of Greenville's YMCA.

As documented by the actions of representatives of Outagamie County, WI DNR, US Army Corps of Engineers, and Gannett Media, there have been a number of violations by Town officials that individuals with far less experience and maturity than those involved should be able to avoid. This matter will continue to be investigated and processed to its natural conclusion by the parties involved. Hence, this is not the problem we wish to address.

Far more serious is the evidence that an elected official, Michael Woods, has used his position and influence within Town government to create tens of thousands of dollars in Town expenditures for a project with a goal of personal gain. It should be obvious that these actions violate the code of ethics our elected officials pledge to uphold.

Be assured that we will be watching the resolution of this matter closely during the following weeks. At an appropriate time, we plan to take action to escalate the awareness of Town residents of the ethical lapses and tax burden of these actions.

Any resolution that falls short of complete mitigation of the illegal excavations, with all costs born by Supervisor Woods, will be considered less than satisfactory. This should serve as a guide to action going forward.
